



- CDC still does not recommend non-essential travel due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. If you must travel, follow CDC best practices to help keep you and others safe: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/index.html>
- Many states and nations have mandated restrictions in place for those that do travel. We ask that these mandates be adhered to before entering the community.
 - Check with official state websites to determine what restrictions are in place (in states you are traveling to and from)
 - For international travel, check with the State Department, local Embassies and the CDC

- Consider the positivity rate of the county where you are traveling. A high percent positivity indicates high transmission in that community and an increased risk for those traveling to that area for being exposed to COVID-19. We get concerned as positivity rates go over 5% and we start increasing our monitoring and precautionary measures. Rates 10% and above are very high, and additional measures may be implemented.
